Artists' Co-op & MFU Center Planned

A group of MFU craftsmen, artists, and philosophers have now formed and are working together to create a Free University Center. Plans now call for a large structure or several major structures to house a producers' co-operative, large class lecture area, food store, open media room, nursery school, print shop and dance hall. Much of the floorspace will serve multiple functions. The Center will be financed by a percentage of sales or a fixed monthly rental from the craftsmen and artists who would work there. Each craftsman will have his own work and sales area as well as studio space and lockers for part-time member artists. we now have about eight people actively working on this project. And with eight more who really want it -- like enough to work on it -- we can do it.

This Center will be a thing of beauty and warmth for our whole community as well as a source of income for the member craftsmen. It could become a vortex of creative power. Our vision of the Center is growing and changing constantly. Can you help? What are your ideas? We need ideas, workers, lumber, paint, criticism, support, opposition and love. The MFU is organized as a participatory democracy; every member may attend and vote at the monthly General Meeting and at the weekly Coordinating Committee meeting. However, fewer than 5% of the membership attend these meetings, and even fewer really get involved in discussions and in decision-making. As a result, the participatory nature of our university is somewhat weakened.

It may be that the "other 900" are not interested in participation. Possibly, most everyone is too busy with other activities. However, it is also possible that many of our members are not aware of the means by which they can participate in the Free U.

The only way that our democracy can progress from illusion to reality is if you play an active role in the work that is to be done and the decisions that are to be made. Then, we may be able to escape the fate of most other democracies—the evolution of in-groups and power structures governing an apathetic constituency.

Among the important activities through which you can participate in MFU are:

- * Clerical work: typing, tallying; making maps, directories, and schedules; seeking locations for cooperative stores, classes, celebrations; etc.
- * Teaching classes, seminars, and workshops.
- * Attending courses offered by other members
- ★ Auditing the financial records and books of cooperatives
- * working on cooperative activities: the MFU-Store, the Food Thing, Nirvana (coffee house), Santa's workshop (arts and crafts producers), the printing facility, the Free You Newsletter, dance hall, etc.
- ★ Attending Coordinating Committee and General Meetings; think and cast your considered vote on the issues presented
- ★ Tending the MFU Store for two to four hours once or twice a week (especially Thursday and Saturday evenings, and all day Sundays)
- ★ The Free You: submitting articles and writings for publication, typing, layout, collating, stapling, addressing, typing
- ★ Catalog: arranging instructors, meeting places; typing, layout; artwork; printing
- * Tending the Headquarters phones and registration desk (in the rear room of the MFU Store)
- ★ Helping in print shop
- ★ Artwork for the catalogs and The Free You: signs, posters, good cartoons
- * Decorating the various Free U facilities
 If you are turned on to any of these Things, call or
 drop in at Headquarters, and ask to have your name,
 phone, and any ideas you may have added to our Volunta
 List. Our organism functions best when every organ
 comprising it contributes its abilities to the Whole.
